NORTHEAST PENNA. AND WEST VIRGINIA SECTIONS OF A.S.H.E. TO ORGANIZE

Organization plans for two new sections of the American Society of Highway Engineers are being formulated for the Northeast territory of Pennsylvania and at Charleston, West Virginia, while encouraging interest in the Society is being reported at Baltimore, Maryland.

The Northeast Pennsylvania Section to be established in the Scranton-Wilkes-Barre area and to include highway industry people in all Northeast counties of the State, is being organized by a local committee composed of Thomas J. Harrington, P.E., of Scranton, district engineer of Pennsylvania Highway District No. 4-0, chairman, A. Hardin Coon, president of B.G. Coon Construction Co., Luzerne, Pa., and Albert E. Peters, P.E., president of Albert E. Peters Associates, engineering consultants of Scranton.

Similar activities for the establishment of the first out of state segment of the Society are underway in Charleston, West Virginia, by a committee composed of Frank W. Rogers, district engineer of West Virginia Highway District No. 1 at Charleston, B.C. Eacle, of Charleston, highway district accountant, Jack H. Gentry, Charleston, public relations officer for the West Virginia State Roads Commission, and Donald C. Englebreth, district manager for the Charleston branch office of Buchart-Horn, consulting engineers of York. This group will be joined by Joseph L. Thomas, of Nitro, West Virginia, branch manager of Republic Steel Corporation plant there.

At a dinner meeting at the Westmorland Club in Wilkes-Barre on July 22nd, the Northeast Committee met with Society President Walter H. Burke, P.E., of York, and Secretary Ralph T. Smith, of Carlisle; they were joined by Joseph B. Jendrejewski, construction engineer of District 4-0.

The West Virginia committee, at a luncheon meeting at Charleston on July 12th with Joseph R. Katusa, of Carmichaels, Pa., president of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Section of A.S.H.E., and a member of the Society's New Section Committee, discussed the formation of a section of the Society at Charleston, and decided to go ahead with plans to organize.

Organizational meetings for prospective members of the Society are being arranged by both committees and invitations will be sent to all highway industry people in the respective areas after dates and locations are confirmed.

President Burke has expressed confidence in the consumation of both new sections

before the end of 1966. The addition of these sections will bring the total sections of the Society to twelve.

President Burke reports increasing interest developing for the establishment of a section of the Society in Baltimore, Maryland, and plans to arrange a preliminary meeting there in the near future with the principals now involved.

Secretary Smith reports inquiries being received from highway industry people in states adjoining Pennsylvania and some mid-western states, as the knowledge of the justification for our type of Society spreads.

Edition No. 1, of Volume 3, of the SCANNER comes to you this year by direct mail, and expanded to six pages, with a redesigned heading. Four editions of the SCANNER have been authorized for publication during the 1966-1967 Society year—September, December, February and May. The editors with the help of the Public Relations Committee and others, will do everything possible to keep you informed of the activities of the Society and provide appropriate technical information as it becomes available. As the Society grows, so will the SCANNER.

TO RECEIVE CHARTERS

Charter night programs are being arranged by the Pittsburgh and Delaware Valley (Philadelphia) sections during the autumn months. Dates for these occasions have not been announced. Charter presentation ceremonies will be conducted in each case by President Walter H. Burke, P.E.

The publications recommended by the Technical Committee for a "better opportunity of self-education among the members of the Society" are listed below:

1. Journal of the Highway Division, ASCE, March 1966. Contents: Philosophy of service life in culvert design. Hydraulic efficiency in culvert design. New techniques in alinement design and stakeout. Characteristics of soil-asphalt as a rate process. Philosophy of culvert design.
2. Journal of the Structural Division, ASCE, April 1966. Partial contents: Stress analysis of cantilevered bridge slabs. Loads on vertical pile groups. Computer analysis of plane and space structures. Optimum design of constant-depth plate girders.
NOTE: The American Society of Civil Engineers Journals may be obtained by writing to ASCE, 345 East 47th Street, New York, New York 10017. The cost per copy of ASCE Journals varies with the division.
3. Highway Research Record 114 contains reports on nonresidential trip generation, a comparative evaluation of trip distribution procedures, coordinated highway-transit interchange stations, and relationships of traffic and floor space use in central business district. It also contains a survey of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge trans-bay bus riders. Cost: \$3.40.
4. Highway Research Record 117 contains 4 reports. The topics are: Mixing time requirements for bituminous mixes (Ross count method), effect of asphalt viscosity on compaction of bituminous concrete, nuclear asphalt content determinations at the job site, and the three year evaluation of Shell Avenue test road. Cost: \$2.60.
5. Highway Research Record 112 is a compilation of reports dealing with concrete pavement design. Partial contents: Spacing of undoweled joints in plain concrete pavement, an experimental self-stressing concrete pavement, continuously reinforced concrete pavement on Oregon, and friction studies in bonded cement concrete pavement slabs. Cost: \$2.80.
6. Highway Research Board Special Report 87. This is the Highway Capacity Manual dated 1965. This manual is primarily a practical guide. It permits determination of the capacity, service volume, or level of service which will be provided by either a new highway design or an existing highway, under specified conditions. Alternately, given a certain traffic demand, the design necessary to accommodate that demand, the design necessary to accommodate that demand at a given level of service can be determined. Cost: \$8.00 soft cover, \$10.00 hard cover.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS APPROVED

Two amendments to the national constitution were approved by voting ballots of the Society membership in June by overwhelming majorities. Out of 900 ballots mailed, a total of 382 were returned.

On the amendment to revise Article IV, qualifications for the so-called "life membership" classification, the vote was 373 for the amendment and 9 opposed.

On the amendment to revise Article X to enable a more simple method of ballot distribution, etc. when changing the constitution, the vote was 373 for approval of the amendment and 11 opposed.

Since ballot returns met all requirements for amending the constitution, the Board of Directors on June 18, 1966 formally accepted the ballot results and directed that the amendments be published to all sections, which procedure was completed within thirty days after the Board meeting.

ZIP CODE TIME

The Post Office Department has made an announcement concerning Second Class Mailing Privileges and Zip Code procedures. Simply stated, the requirement is that in order to retain Second Class Mailing privileges it will be necessary for the publishers of the SCANNER to adopt the mailing procedure to conform to a rather intricate system which is built upon use of the Zip Code numbers in lieu of state, city and alphabetical listings heretofore used.

The staff is on top of this problem and plans have been initiated to adapt our internal administrative procedures to conform to the new system. No major difficulties are foreseen except those inherent in handling the addresses and adapting them to the new system. Our printer, Copy Cat Press, and the local Post Office officials have kindly offered their assistance to the Society.

The primary purpose of presenting this item is to alert the membership to the necessity of furnishing their Zip Code number and to develop the habit of using it on any and all mail.

C. H. BUCKIUS PASSES

Buck retired as Chief Engineer of the State Department of Highways in 1954 after 37 years of service. He was the youngest man ever to serve as District Engineer, being appointed to that office in Clearfield at the age of 27.

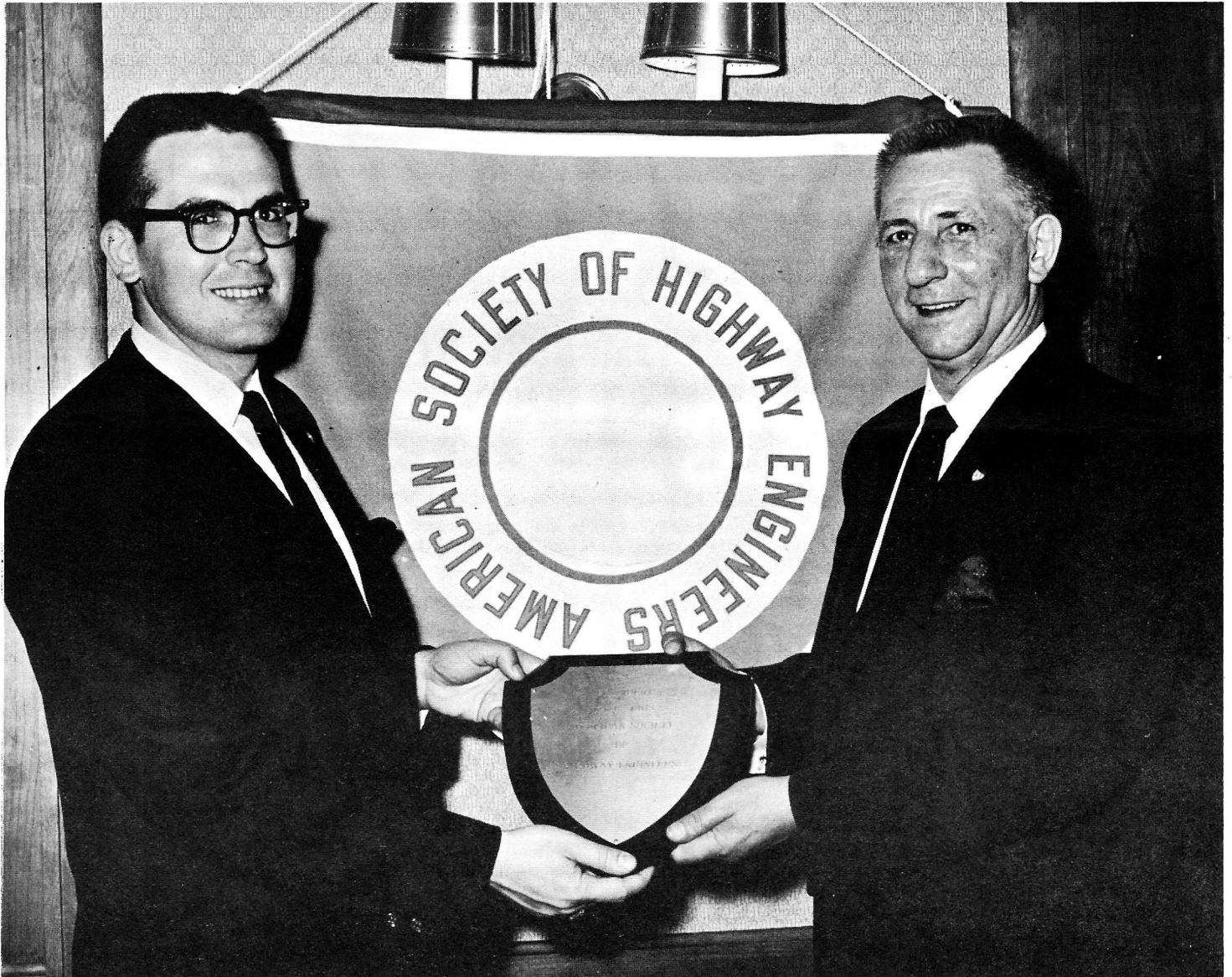

DO YOU KNOW THAT

It may some day be cheaper to build city freeways underground than on the surface? This idea comes from the International Road Federation, which attributes the situation to the continual rise in surface land values and advances in tunnel technology. Between 1930 and 1960 the cost of tunneling dropped 46 percent (from \$6.7 million to \$3.8 million per lane mile), while the cost of the cheapest city freeway went up from \$210,000 to \$1,000,000 per lane mile.
